

Minutes

The Collinsville City Council met in regular session, April 14, 1997.
The meeting was called to order at 7 P.M. by Mayor Mc Corkle.
Present were Councilmembers Thomas Byrom, Wesley Overstreet, Jimmy Perdue, Randy Woody and Jo Walkup.

Minutes of the March meeting was approved with motion by Ms. Walkup, sec. by Mr. Byrom and carried.

The March financial report was accepted with motion by Mr. Byrom, sec. by Ms. Walkup and carried.

Old Business:

A. Construction:

Mayor Mc Corkle reported: the replacement of a water line in the 100 block of South Main.

The installation of a 24" horn at the intersection of Murdock & Elder: Sewer line on N. Broadway street is too shallow--will have to be replaced:

Contractor installing water service for Mr. Weaver on Hwy. 377 south is placing a casing under the highway that will carry a 6" line: Installation of 6" line to supply Denton Addition with water service will be start in front of Roy Blair's & go east, on school property, to Broadway, north on Broadway and cross to the east side at Mr. Byrom's.

B. Ordinance # 325 declaring South Neathery from 902 to Humm street as a fire zone was read passed with motion by Ms. Walkup, sec. by Mr. Woody and carried.

C. C. Speed on North Broadway:

Continuance problems with the speed, on N. Broadway by the school, prompted the council to install speed bumps appx. 60 ft. south of the north city limits and at the entrance of the school parking lot. Motion to install the bumps was made by Mr. Byrom, sec. by Mr. Perdue and carried unanimously.

D. Building for Fire Dept:

Mayor McCorkle has spoken to Lemmons House Movers concerning the removal of the old house at 119 Woodland. Mr. Lemmons stated he would move the house for no charge if he would not be required to clean the lot. The agreement reached was for Mr. Lemmons to remove the house and city workers will clean the lot.

E. Park Board--Paula Delka

Ms. Delka gave a report of the first Park Board meeting held on March 18th. The board currently has 5 members. She stated that a general cleanup day scheduled for April 5th was canceled due to rain. She asked for council input on ways to raise money and make the park safe. The possibility of hosting baseball tournaments as a means to raise funds was discussed. The need for better lighting and installing cable across the driveways, to be locked at night, were also discussed. Mayor McCorkle assured Ms. Delka that the city would remove the piles of dirt, clay tile, etc. and mow as soon as possible.

New Business:

A. Truck Parking -- East Side Of 377
City employees recieved a complaint of cattle trucks parking on the east side of 377 and the ~~order~~ ^{order} from the trucks.
The Mayor is to check on the ownership of the property.

B. Executive Session---Performance of Employees
Mayor McCorkle took the council into closed session at 8:08 p.m. returning to open session at 8:40 p.m. at which time the following report was given:

Motion to increase Bill Morgan to \$1800.00 per month effective 4-30-97 was made by Ms.Walkup, sec. by Mr.Byrom and carried unanimously.
Motion to increase Frances Pilcher to \$1550.00 per month effective 4-30-97 was made by Mr.Byrom, sec. by Ms.Walkup and carried unanimously.
Motion to increase Mark Patterson to \$1900.00 effective 6-1-97 was made by Mr..Byrom, sec. by Mr.Woody and carried with 1 opposing vote by Mr.Overstreet.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:46 p.m. with motion by Ms.Walkup, sec. by Mr.Byrom and carried.
