

Due to increasing amounts of trash in recycle containers, we are sending out this guide for you to know what are and what are not acceptable materials for your recycle container. ## Acceptable Recyclable Items:

- Aluminum, steel or tin cans
- Cardboard
- Catalogs, Magazines and Phonebooks
- Glass bottles or jars

## Unacceptable Items:

- Aluminum Foil
- Hazardous Waste
- Milk Cartons
- Packing Peanuts
- Loose shopping bags
- Grass, leaves or other yard waste
- Wood
- Styrofoam
- Tissue Paper
- Wax Paper
- Window Glass
- Light bulbs
- Vehicle parts
- Ammo

- Junk mail
- Shredded paper MUST be bagged
- Newspaper
- Plastics #1 5, #7 (not #6)\*
- Items with electrical cords
- Ceramics
- Dishes
- Cement and Bricks
- Dead animals
- Clothing or fabric of any kind
- Food wrappers or pizza boxes
- Cigarette butts
- Toys
- Diapers
- Household batteries (Check with local electronics and battery retailers for household battery recycling services.)

<sup>\*</sup>For plastic items, look for a small recycle symbol with a number. This is often printed on the bottom of containers and near any labeling on bags and other objects.
